

Canada-US 2006 Softwood Lumber Agreement Expiry

From one of *Madison's* valued sources Friday:

"In that the SLA will expire at 11:59 p.m. October 12th, though we've been unable to secure written confirmation at this time through the U.S. DOC or the Canadian DFAIT offices as to exactly what procedures will be involved after the 12th, we can only assume Canada will continue to require Export Permits, but without the Export Surcharges. This would enable them to monitor and record volumes for U.S. DOC comparison purposes, as well, in the event of another ADD/ CVD investigation resulting in potential quotas being imposed, the proper allocations can be determined.

We wanted to advise our clients of the October Export Surcharge increase as soon as possible, enabling them to make their forecasts."

Housing Starts, Japan: July 2015

Japan's housing starts in July were 78,263 units (up 7.4 per cent from the same month in the previous year), surpassing the previous year's result for five months in a row, according to Japan Lumber Journal Tuesday. Starts of owner occupied houses were 25,396 units (up 8 per cent), increasing for three months in a row. Of the owner occupied houses, housing starts financed by private sector were 22,322 units (up 5.4 per cent), increasing for two consecutive months, and those by public sector were 3,074 units (up 30.6 per cent), increasing for five consecutive months.

US Housing Starts: August 2015

Home-building in the US slipped in August, with declines in both single-family and apartment-building construction.

US housing starts fell 3 per cent from a month earlier to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 1.126 million last month, the Commerce Department said Thursday

Moreover, new applications for building permits rose 3.5 per cent to 1.17 million, from a revised July rate of 1.13 million.

Permits for single-family homes rose to 699,000, the highest since January 2008. CONT'D PAGE 7

Japan Timber Import: 1H 2015

The amount of foreign logs received in Japan during the first half of 2015 was 1.71 million cubic metres (a 27.1 per cent decrease compared to the same period last year), said the Japan Lumber Journal Tuesday. The amount of lumber products received was 3.05 million cubic metres (a 11.6 per cent drop). The total combined was 4.76 million cubic metres (a 17.9 per cent decrease). CONT'D PAGE 8



Housing Starts, US

CONT'D FROM PAGE 2 Starts on single-family homes, which account for nearly two-thirds of the market, fell to 739,000. Multifamily units, which include apartments and condominiums, fell to 387,000.

Three of four regions showed decreases in starts last month, led by a 33.7 percent slump in the Northeast, according to the report. The South showed the only advance.

Construction levels for new homes remain low by historical standards. Despite this month's slip, housing starts were 16.6 per cent higher in August than a year ago, and permits were up 12.5 per cent from a year ago.

New home construction in the South rose to 590,000 in August, the highest level since late 2007 and 10.1 per cent above the year-ago figure.

The National Association of Home Builders/Wells Fargo builder sentiment index rose to 62 this month, the highest level since October 2005, from 61 in August, the group's report showed Wednesday. Measures of buyer traffic and single-family sales both advanced.

"The housing recovery will continue to be bumpy, but we expect it to continue." said Michelle Meyer, deputy head of US economics at Bank of America Corp in New York, NY. "The labor market has improved, the economy has improved and we're seeing pent-up demand for housing. So the backdrop is very supportive."

Japan Main Foreign Timber Import: First Half 2015

Japan Log Imports

The amount of Japan's log imports for the first half of 2015 included:

- 1,28 million cubic metres (a 26.3 per cent decrease) from North America;
- 233,335 cubic metres (a 26.7 per cent drop) from New Zealand;
- 114,870 cubic metres (14.8 per cent less than last year) from Southsea region; and,
 - 72,261 m3 (a 49.6 per cent decrease) from Russia.

Due to the falling yen in the exchange rate, the increase in demand in the producing regions, and the sluggishness in demand in Japan, North American logs, which account for 75 per cent of the total share, greatly decreased.

With the effects of the strengthening of illegal logging measures in the producing regions, logs from Southsea region had a 2-digit fall, and Russian logs also decreased about 50 per cent compared to the results of the same period last year, brought on by the decrease in demand and the decrease in logging in the producing regions.

Japan Lumber Imports

The amount of lumber products received included:

- 1.14 million cubic metres (a 19.2 per cent decrease) of European lumber;
- 1.15 million cubic metres (a 5.4 per cent drop) of North American lumber;

• 258,307 cubic metres (15.1 per cent

• 337,761 cubic metres (7.2 per cent

• 258,307 cubic metres (15.1 per cent lower) of Southsea lumber with all the main items decreasing.

Especially the amount of lumber products received from Europe has continued to be in a low condition since the latter half of last year due to the sluggishness in new housing construction starts in Japan and adjustments in production in the producing regions.

Expectations for Japan Log and Lumber Imports

In the future for logs due to the decrease in logging in the producing regions, a decrease in logs received from North America is expected, and factors leading to an increase in the amount received from Southsea region and Russia are not seen. Also with a falling yen, the amount of logs received in general is expected to remain at a low level.

Concerning lumber products, domestic demand is seen as improving going into autumn, but for European lumber, forecasting the future is difficult due to factors in the producing regions such as a decrease in production by manufacturers. Due to a shortage of logs and demand being in good condition in North America, the possibility of an increase of North American lumber products headed for Japan is seen as very low.

Russian lumber products, which are supposed to improve in its import environment due to a weakening ruble, lack of stability in supplies, and Southsea lumber products are not expected to increase due to logging in the producing regions being in a low condition, so with the substitution by domestically produced lumber moving ahead, the amount of lumber products received from abroad is expected to continue to be in a low condition compared with last year.
