Year-End for North America's Lumber Industry Arrives with a Bang

As sawmills across Canada and the US start to make their usual year-end curtailment and maintenance upgrade plans, producers look forward to a New Year 2018 as busy as it was this year. These current high lumber prices have everyone boggling their minds, but it's likely there will be

some shocks coming at the start of next year as those prices could climb even higher.

Ongoing sustained strong demand — extremely unusual for this time of year — and the sharp reduction in timber supply to some critical areas due to the wildfires, as well as the imposition of a steep softwood lumber duty by the US on Canadian imports, are largely responsible for very strong lumber prices. Canada Softwood Lumber WTO Case

Even in advance of the final International Trade Commission determination, Canada's Foreign Trade Ministry formally requested World Trade Organization (WTO) consultations with the United States concerning the US Department of Commerce's recent final anti-dumping and countervailing duty determinations on imports of certain softwood lumber products from Canada, said *Woodworking.net* Wednesday.

Canada on Tuesday formally opened a case against the United States at the World Trade Organization over a recent Commerce Department decision to impose duties on Canadian lumber exports, the foreign ministry said, *according to Reuters* Tuesday. <u>CONT'D PAGE 7</u>

Sawmill Fires

A building was damaged when a fire started early Monday at the Curtis Lumber yard on Route 67, in Albany, NY, *according toTimes Union*.

The fire at the home improvement complex was reported at about 3:30 am, a company official said. Elsewhere, emergency crews are at the scene of fire at a lumber yard in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, according to *Penn Live*.

That fire was first reported Thursday morning at H.M. Stauffer & Sons along Glenola Drive in Upper Leacock Township, said Lancaster County 911.

US and Canada GDP: 3Q 2017

Real gross domestic product (GDP) in the US increased at an annual rate of 3.3 per cent in 3Q 2017, according to the "second" estimate released by the **US Bureau of Economic Analy**sis, Wednesday. In 2Q, real GDP increased 3.1 per cent.


In Canada, real gross domestic product rose 0.2 per cent in September after edging down 0.1 per cent in August. Goods-producing, up +0.4 per cent, and services-producing, up +0.1 per cent, industries rose as 12 of 20 industrial sectors grew, led by the mining, quarrying and oil and gas extraction sector, said **Statistics Canada** Friday.



US Thanksgiving Usually Year-End Slow Time

Sawmill order files, especially in the northwest, shrank down to one week or less as wood ordered a month ago finally made it's way through the supply chain to anxious customers

Most new ordering was for fill-in needs — as would be expected for this time of year — however locating suppliers with that mix of product on hand was tricky.

In the end demand has slowed down in this week following the big US Thanksgiving holiday.

At this point most operators are looking toward closing their yards for year-end. Québec will soon start on it's annual twoweek shutdown. Much stock-taking and inventory-accounting, of both logs and lumber, will be taking place.

Before the end of this year, much better word of the immediate loss of timber supply to areas of North America affected by wildfires is expected; most especially from the **BC Ministry of Forests**.

Canada Takes US to WTO Over Softwood Lumber

A Canadian Foreign Ministry statement Tuesday said Canada would forcefully defend the lumber industry against the "unfair, unwarranted and deeply troubling" decision, according to *Reuters* Tuesday.

Earlier this month Canada launched a NAFTA trade challenge against duties affecting about US\$5.66 annually billion worth of US lumber imports.

The Office of the US Trade Representative is confident the Department of Commerce's actions "fully comply" with WTO rules, said USTR spokeswoman Amelia Breinig, in a statement.

In any case, Canada's decision to open a case with the WTO is premature, she said, since final duties are not yet in place, pending a decision by the US International Trade Commission on whether imports of Canadian lumber have harmed US producers.

The Canadian government said it has requested consultations with the US under the WTO, said *CBC* also Tuesday.

Canada is also fighting the case through NAFTA's dispute-resolution system, accord-

ing to Canadian Press.

Leacock Township suffered serious injuries after a fire in a storage building on Thursday morning, according to *Penn Live*.

Firefighters said the fire started around 8:30 at H.M Stauffer and Sons. Deputy Chief Nelson Dagen with Upper Leacock Fire Company said the employee who was burned was the only person in the storage facility at the time the fire started.

Dagen told ABC 27 News the employee, who needed to be taken to burn centre in

Chester County, had to walk through flames in order to escape the building.

Despite windy conditions firefighters were able to contain the flames to one building, which is destroyed. A number of employee cars were damaged due to the intense heat from the fire.

There was no immediate cause of the fire, but a fire marshal from the State Police was on scene investigating.


Officials urged residents in Upper Leacock Township to conserve water due to the amount of water used in the fire. Management from H.M. Stauffer and Sons gave ABC 27 News a statement that said they expect to resume normal business operations starting next week.

At Curtis Lumber in New York, a security guard noticed that power went out at one of the buildings and a odd odour filled the air, John Hallgren, Curtis Lumber's vice president said to *Times Union*.

The flames were noticed a short time later. Hallgren said the fire was contained to one building and some building supplies were destroyed, he said.

So far, no injuries were reported.

Firefighters from five different companies were summoned to the fire scene.




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
